REPORT OF HEAD OF DEMOCRATIC SERVICES

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To enable Members to consider the objection received to Tree Preservation Order No. 380 (2006) located at Field West of Bottomdale Caravan Park, Slyne-with-Hest, and thereafter whether or not to confirm the Order.

This matter will be dealt with in accordance with the adopted procedure for considering matters relating to individual applications, that is, the relevant matters for consideration by the Committee will be presented in the public part of the meeting, and the decision will be made after the exclusion of the press and public, on the basis that, in making its decision, the Committee will receive exempt information in the form of legal advice on possible legal proceedings arising from the decision (Paragraph 5 of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972).

RECOMMENDATIONS

That Members consider the objection to Tree Preservation Order No. 380 (2006), located at Field West of Bottomdale Caravan Park, Slyne-with-Hest, and decide whether or not to confirm the Order.

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 Under Section 198 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, the Local Planning Authority may make an Order in respect of a tree or group of trees if it appears that it is expedient in the interests of amenity to make provision for the protection of trees in their area.
- 1.2 In accordance with the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation Order) Regulations 1999, an objection has been received to Tree Preservation Order No. 380 (2006), which has been made on a single beech tree located at Field West of Bottomdale Caravan Park, Slyne-with-Hest.
- 1.3 The objection is from John Martin Fish and the reasons for his objection are detailed in correspondence at Appendix A. The location of the tree in question is shown at Appendix B.

1.4 In accordance with the Regulations, it is necessary to consider the objection, and in order for the objection to be considered objectively, the matter is referred to the Appeals Committee.

2.0 Proposal Details

2.1 The purpose of the report is to provide Members with details to enable them to decide whether or not to confirm Tree Preservation Order No. 380 (2006).

I have spoken at length with Andrew Holden regarding the above subject and also met on site Maxine Knagg. I give notice that I wish to object to the imposition of the above Tree Preservation Order for the following reasons ~

1. I believe that the proposed Tree Preservation Order is not a lawful use of Tree Preservation Order legislation. The Tree Preservation Order is being used a means to prevent development at Bottomdale Caravan Park. (Surely the consent or rejection of a planning application should only be determined by the relevant legislation of Planning and Building Control and no other matter?)

2. A Tree Preservation Order is to protect trees for their amenity value to the surrounding area and in the above case should be considered only *if and when* planning consent is granted. (otherwise all trees should be protected so that in the event of a successful planning application the tree(s) would be protected!)

3. The tree in question has been in the ownership of the Fish Estate for nearly 100 years and the Fish Estate have an unblemished record with the trees on their land. The imposition of a Tree Preservation Order is therefore unnecessary.

I look forward to hearing from you that the above Tree Preservation Order will not be confirmed.


