#### RECOMMENDATIONS

That consideration be given to the objections received and thereafter the implementation of The City Council of Lancaster (Various Roads) (On Street Parking Places Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (No 2) Order 2006

#### 1.0 Introduction

The statutory procedure for making an Order, under Section 1, 2, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49, 53, 63A and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act, 1984 is set out in the Traffic Orders (Procedures) Regulations, 1989 (as amended). A draft Order was drafted and advertised in accordance with those regulations and subsequently the following objections were received:

#### 2.0 Proposal Details

2.1 Details of the proposal are contained in Appendix A

#### 3.0 Details of Consultation

#### 3.1 <u>Tower Court</u>

Twenty letters of objection to the proposed residents parking scheme were received, the following points were raised:

- i) It was generally believed that the communal areas of Tower Court, which includes the visitor parking area, belong to the Tower Court Estate, for which the residents pay a maintenance charge. Some objectors state that this is shown in a covenant on their deeds.
- ii) The loss of the visitor parking spaces would devalue the properties in Tower Court.
- iii) Residents' private parking spaces would not be safeguarded by the scheme.
- iv) The general public would be brought into the communal gardens and areas maintained at the residents expense.
- v) Two copies of a letter from the City Council stating that Tower Court would not be part of a residents' parking scheme were received.
- vi) There will be nowhere for visitors or tradesmen to park.
- vii) The proposals are a breach of the original planning consent which stated that 1.5 parking spaces per dwelling must be provided.
- viii) Commuter parking is not a problem in Tower Court at the moment.
- ix) The increase in traffic as Permit holders search for a space would be a road safety issue for both pedestrians and cars in the Tower Court area as it was not designed to be a public car park.

#### 3.2 <u>Meadowside/South Road</u>

One letter of objection was received, the resident objects to having to pay to park in his street and feels that there will be competition for spaces with residents of South Road who will be unable to park outside their own homes.

#### 3.3 Percy Road

One letter of objection was received, the objector believes that the proposals will cause parking problems where previously there have been none, she also objects to the charge for a resident's permit.

#### 3.4 South Road

Fifty one letters of objection to the proposed no waiting at any time restriction on South Road were received, the following points were raised:

- i) Properties on South Road would be devalued.
- ii) The aged and disabled who have to rely on friends, family, taxis and delivery people for assistance, all of whom must park nearby, would be disadvantaged.
- iii) Residents, especially those with small children would be seriously inconvenienced if they are not able to park near home to unload shopping etc.
- iv) Tradespeople who must have access to their vehicles would be inconvenienced.
- v) Elderly relatives would be prevented from visiting and all visitors would have difficulty parking.
- vi) Traffic congestion would be caused by loading/unloading, one resident is a tradesman who must load/unload his tools from his van each

morning/evening for insurance reasons, this is sometimes a lengthy process. Many of the residents are students who must load/unload their belongings several times a year. All residents must load/unload shopping etc.

vii) Most of the properties on South Road have no access from the rear of the property or off street parking provision.

#### 3.5 <u>Greaves Road</u>

Two letters of objection to the proposed no waiting at any time restrictions and residents parking scheme were received from residents of Greaves Road, the following points were raised

- i) It is unfair to have to pay to park outside ones own house when car owners have already paid to park on all of Britain's roads.
- ii) Not allowing people to park on Greaves Road will make them park in Sulby Drive outside somebody else's home, many of the parents on Sulby Drive are already concerned that the road is unsafe due to parked cars.
- iii) It is unfair for commercial vehicles to have to pay double when they often take up no more space than private cars.

Lancashire County Council Environment Directorate have been consulted.

The police have been consulted

The Ward Councillors have been consulted.

#### 4.0 Options and Options Analysis (including risk assessment)

#### 5.0 Officer Preferred Option (and comments)

- 5.1 The officer preferred option is to make the order with amendments that:
  - i) Remove the proposal to introduce a 'No Waiting At Any Time' restriction in South Road.
  - ii) Remove the revocation relating to South Road, easterly side, in The City Council Lancaster (Various Roads) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 1) Order 1987

With regard to the objections:-

- 5.2 The proposed parking restrictions in Tower Court are to be introduced on the adopted highway, not private land. The covenants referred to by residents are private covenants between the developer and the purchasers of the properties.
- 5.3 Property owners do not have a right to park on the public highway and, in making traffic regulation orders, any effect on property value is not considered.
- 5.4 The letters written in 1998 stating that the Transportation Service Group decided not to introduce a scheme in the Tower Court area stated the reason that the scheme would create enforcement difficulties. The transfer of parking enforcement powers

from the Police to a contractor who is managed by the highway authority means that this is no longer the case.

- 5.5 Visitors and tradesmen may park in residents' bays providing that they display the appropriate permit.
- 5.6 The planning conditions relating to the provision of parking spaces in the area of the development may have stated a minimum number of spaces based on the number of properties, but there is no reduction in the overall number of parking spaces. Notwithstanding any planning requirement on developers to provide parking spaces, the highway authority has the power to remove or amend parking places.
- 5.7 The extension of the existing residents' parking scheme to include properties in South Road etc. is expected to place additional demands on the public parking areas in streets such as Tower Court and Percy Road and it is therefore recommended that these streets be included in the zone. In addition, the proposed will remove the parking by commuters that currently occurs there.
- 5.8 The highway authority has the power to create parking places and charge for their use.
- 5.9 The objections put forward by South Road residents will be addressed if the proposed introduction of a 'No Waiting' restriction in South Road is abandoned.

#### 6.0 Conclusion

- 6.1 Whilst it is acknowledged that the introduction of the scheme will mean a reduction in areas where some residents currently park, the Council has received many requests for the existing 'South Zone' residents' parking scheme to be extended to include other streets in the area and it is considered that the proposals contained in the order will improve the quality of life for many residents.
- 6.2 The County Council has been approached regarding the possibility of a bus lane being introduced in South Road and it has confirmed there is no proposal to introduce one there in the imminent future, and therefore it is recommended that the proposed 'No Waiting' restriction in South Road should be removed from the traffic regulation order.
- 6.3 The City Council's Ward Members have been consulted and the following responses were received:
  - i) 3 Members want the Tower Court area to be removed from the proposed residents' parking zone.
  - ii) 4 Members support the removal of the proposed 'No Waiting' restrictions in South Road from the Order.

#### RELATIONSHIP TO POLICY FRAMEWORK

Corporate Plan – Priority 3 – Making our environment cleaner and healthier including managing transport and parking.

The City Council is committed to the development of sustainable communities that are less reliant on the ownership and use of cars. Where there is sufficient demand, the Council is committed to the provision of residents' parking schemes where residents are given priority for on-street car parking places.

The City Council of Lancaster (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act, 1972 with the County Council of Lancashire in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49, 53, 63A and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(hereinafter called the "1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and Section 43 and Schedules 3 and 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1991(hereinafter called the "1991 Act") hereby make the following order.

#### 1. <u>Commencement, Citation and Revocation</u>

- 1.1 This Order shall come into operation on ??????? and may be cited as " The City Council of Lancaster (Various Roads)(On Street Parking Places Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting)(No 2) Order 2006".
- 1.2 The Orders specified in the first column of Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked insofar as they relate to the lengths of road specified in the second column of the said Schedule.

#### 2. Interpretations

- 2.1 Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 2.2 In this order, except where the context otherwise, requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them: -
  - 2.2.1 "1984 Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Road Traffic Act 1991.
  - 2.2.2 "Authorised Parking Place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagrams 1032 or 1033 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
  - 2.2.3 "Care at Home Service" means a service provided by a recognised agency carrying out domicilary work for a resident who is elderly or disabled, at the home of the resident;
  - 2.2.4 "Carers Permit" means a Carers Permit issued under the provisions of the City Council of Lancaster (Parking Permits and Charges) Order 2004, as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment ;
  - 2.2.5 "Carers Permit Holder" means a person to whom a Carers Permit has been issued;

- 2.2.6 "Centre Line" means the centre line of a highway as shown on Ordnance Survey graphical information systems at the time that the order was prepared
- 2.2.7 "Coach Parking Place" means any area of highway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.3 variant in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
- 2.2.8 "Disabled Person" means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.
- 2.2.9 "Disabled Persons Badge" means a badge which:-
  - was issued or has effect as if issued to a disabled person or institution under the Disabled Persons (Badge for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000 or under regulations having effect in Scotland or Wales under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970; and
  - 2.) has not ceased to be in force.
- 2.2.10 "Disabled Person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
- 2.2.11 "Driver" in relation to a vehicle left at or waiting in a Parking Place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left at or is waiting at the Parking Place.
- 2.2.12 "Dual Purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as in Regulation 3 of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986;
- 2.2.13 "Enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general, or local and includes any order, bylaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;
- 2.2.14 "Goods Vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods and burden of any description or a trailer so constructed or adapted;
- 2.2.15 "Highway Boundary" means the borderline of the highway as shown on the plans of the adopted highway produced and kept by the Highway authority or its agents.
- 2.2.16 "Invalid Carriage" means a mechanically propelled vehicle of which the unladen weight does not exceed 254 kilograms and which is specifically designed and constructed and not merely adapted for the use of a person suffering from some physical defect or disability and is used solely by such a person as defined in S.185 of the Road Traffic Act 1988
- 2.2.17 "Light Goods Vehicle" means a Goods Vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description whose laden weight does not exceed 2040kg.
- 2.2.18 "Loading" and "Unloading" means the continuous transference from (or to) a vehicle to (or from) premises adjacent to where the vehicle is parked of heavy or unmanageable Goods that are not designed to be carried by hand other than over a very short distance.

- 2.2.19 "Magistrate Enforcement Officer" means an officer employed by Lancashire Magistrates Courts Commission for the purpose of arresting persons who have failed to pay penalties imposed by law;
- 2.2.20 "Motor Cycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an invalid carriage) with fewer than 4 wheels, of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms;
- 2.2.21 "Parking Attendant" means a parking attendant as defined in S.63A of The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which is inserted by S44 (1) of the Road Traffic Act 1991).
- 2.2.22 "Parking Charge" means the sum specified.
- 2.2.23 "Parking Disc" means a device which-
  - 1) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue, if issued on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2000 or orange if issued before that date;
  - 2) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
  - 3) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun.
- 2.2.24 "Parking Place" means an area on a highway designated or authorised and described as a parking place by any of the various Articles or Schedules of this Order;
- 2.2.25 "Parking Services Manager" means a person appointed by the Council to administer the powers conferred on the Council by the 1984 Act and the 1991 Act with respect to this and other Traffic Regulation Orders.
- 2.2.26 "Parking Waiver" means a document issued by the Parking Services Manager to temporarily exempt a vehicle from the waiting restriction in a restricted road.
- 2.2.27 "Passenger Vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver, and not drawing a trailer;
- 2.2.28 "Pay and Display Parking Place" means any area of highway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagrams 1028.4 variant, 1032 when individual bays are required or 1033 as specified within The Traffic Signs and General Directions 2002 as appropriate with respect to Article 21 but excluding any Disabled Persons Parking Places.
- 2.2.29 "Penalty Charge" and "Reduced Penalty Charge" means a charge set and varied from time to time under the provisions of Section 74 of the 1991 Act, such charge being payable by virtue of Paragraph 3(1) and (2) of Schedule 3 of the Act of 1991 in the manner set out in the Penalty Charge Notice.
- 2.2.30 "Penalty Charge Notice" means a Notice issued by a Parking pursuant to the provisions of Section 66 and Schedule 3 of the Act of 1991.
- 2.2.31 "Permit" means a permit or card issued under the provisions of the City Council of Lancaster (Parking Permits and Charges) Order 2004,

as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment;

- 2.2.32 "Permitted Hours" means in accordance with the periods specified in the corresponding Schedules.
- 2.2.33 "Registered Keeper" in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;
- 2.2.34 "Relevant Position" means:-
  - In the case of a Disabled Person's Badge or Parking Disc means the position defined in Section 4 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons)(England) Regulations 2000;
  - (b) In the case of a Resident's Permit, Residents Visitor card or Tradesman Permit as follows
    - in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the permit is exhibited thereon so that the front of the permit and details of vehicle registration number are legible from outside the vehicle;
      - in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge or permit is exhibited in a conspicuous and readable position on the front or near side of the vehicle,
- 2.2.35 "Relevant Zone" means that zone in which a resident (as hereinafter defined) resides;
- 2.2.36 "Resident" means a person whose usual residence is at premises the postal address of which is in a road or part of a road within the Zones stated in this Order;
- 2.2.37 "Residents Parking Permit" means a residents permit issued under the provisions of the City Council of Lancaster (Parking Permits and Charges) Order 2004, as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment, and "residents permit holder" means a person to whom such a permit has been issued;
- 2.2.38 "Residents Visitor Card" means a visitor's card issued under the provisions of the City Council of Lancaster (Parking Permits and Charges) Order 2004, as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment:
- 2.2.39 "Road" means any length of highway or of any other road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which a road passes;
- 2.2.40 "Telecommunications Apparatus" has the same meaning as in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984.
- 2.2.41 "Tradesman" means persons working at premises within a zone;
- 2.2.42 "Tradesmans Permit" means a tradesman's permit issued under the provisions of the City Council of Lancaster (Parking Permits and Charges) Order 2004, as amended or substituted by any subsequent

enactment:

- 2.2.43 "Traffic Sign" means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under, Section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2.2.44 "Trailer" means any vehicle other than a motor vehicle.
- 2.2.45 "Universal Service Provider" has the same meaning as that assigned to it under the Postal Services Act 2000 (Consequential Modifications to Local Enactment No1) Order 2001.
- 2.2.46 "Valid Hours" in relation to the parking places specified in Schedule 8 to this Order means all hours;
- 2.2.47 "Vehicle" means a motor vehicle, a passenger vehicle, a dualpurpose vehicle, a goods vehicle, a motorcycle or an invalid carriage.
- 2.2.48 "Visitor" means either i. any person visiting a resident ii. any tradesman (as defined above)
- 2.2.49 "Zone" means an area outlined by a black line on a Zone Plan appended to this order and any one zone may be referred to by the reference letter on the plan of that zone.
- 2.3 Any reference in this order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment.
- 2.4 Any reference in this order to a masculine gender shall include reference to the feminine gender and neuter gender.
- 2.5 Any reference in this Order to a singular includes the plural.
- 2.6 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2.7 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
- 2.8 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a road specified in the schedules to this Order bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway is designated as a Parking Place subject to the restrictions and provisions set out in this Order.

#### PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS ON THE WAITING OF VEHICLES

#### 3. Waiting Restrictions

#### <u>No Waiting</u>

3.1 Save as provided in Article 4 of this order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in the first column of schedule 2 to this Order on the side or sides of road specified in the second column of the said schedule.

#### Limited Waiting

3.2 Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the

direction, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait more than 1 hour, return prohibited within 2 hours, between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive, in any of the roads specified in the first column of Schedule 3 to this Order on the side or sides of road specified opposite that road or length of road in the second column of the said Schedule.

#### **Residents**

3.3 Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle which is not displaying in the relevant position a valid Residents Parking Permit, Tradesman Permit, or Residents Visitor Card to wait in any of the parking places specified in Schedule 4 to this Order.

#### Disabled

3.4 Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle which is not displaying in the relevant position a valid Disabled Persons Badge to wait in any of the parking places specified in Schedule 5 to this Order.

#### 4 Exemptions from Waiting Restrictions

- 4.1 Nothing in Articles 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, or 3.4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road or on the side of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
  - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) a vehicle which is in the service of or employed by a "Universal Service Provider" to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in accordance with the Postal Services Act 2000;
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
    - i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
    - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or side of road; or
    - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair or servicing in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of road or side of road of any sewer or of any pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984:
  - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any road, to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (e) the vehicle to be employed in the recovery of another vehicle;
  - (f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
  - (g) a Public Service Vehicle to be used in the operation of a local service waiting during a Layover period at any duly authorised bus stop or bus stand;

- (h) the vehicle to wait at or near any premises situated on or adjacent to the said side or any of the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral.
- 4.2 Nothing in Article 3.1, or 3.2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle in the lengths of road referred to in the said Articles.
- 4.3 Nothing in Article 3.1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any lengths of road or on the side of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).
- 4.4 Nothing in Article 3.2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, to wait in any lengths of road or on the side of road referred to in the said Article.
- 4.5 Nothing in Article 3.3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the roads, lengths of road or sides of road referred to in any of the said Articles for a period of up to 10 minutes, return prohibited within four hours, for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle in the lengths of road referred to therein.
- 4.6 Nothing in Article 3.3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a valid Carers Permit to wait in any of the parking places referred to in the said Article for a period of 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 4 hours from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in that road).

#### 5. CONDUCT OF PARKING PLACES

- 5.1 PROVIDED ALWAYS that the provisions of Article 5 of this Order shall apply to any parking place and, in the event of any contravention of, or noncompliance with, a provision of Article 5 of this Order, the person responsible shall be guilty of an offence.
- 5.2 The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- 5.3 Every vehicle left in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall so stand that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking space.

- 5.4 The Council may, by Notice or by Order, suspend the use of any parking place or any part thereof:-
  - (a) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line or traffic sign;
  - (b) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (c) for preventing obstruction of the streets on the occasion of any public procession rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed;
  - (d) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository.
- 5.5 A Police Constable in uniform may suspend for no longer than 24 hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety; or
  - (b) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that the Council or the Police Constable in uniform in suspending the use of a parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Article shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or the part thereof the use of which is suspended such traffic signs as are necessary to indicate that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.

- 5.6 A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-
  - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining a road or the use of a road by other persons or so as to be a nuisance;
  - (b) when such parking place has been closed or suspended in accordance with the provisions of the Article of this Order.
- 5.7 (a) when a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of or non-compliance with any of the provisions of this order a Police Constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place.
  - (c) In case of an emergency a Police Constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter the position of that vehicle in the parking place; or remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place to any place he thinks fit.

- 5.8 Any person altering the position of a vehicle in, or removing a vehicle from, a parking place by virtue of the last preceding Article of this order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.
- 5.9 When a Police Constable or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 5.7 of this part of the Order he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

#### 6 PROVISIONS RELATING TO RESIDENTS PERMITS, VISITOR PERMITS, TRADESMANS PERMITS, AND CARERS PERMITS

- 6.1 The provisions relating to the validity of Residents Permits, Visitor Permits, Tradesmans Permits and Carers Permits for use in a parking place authorised by this order shall be determined by reference to the Schedules and Articles of this order and by reference to the City Council of Lancaster (Parking Permits and Charges) Order 2004, as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment.
- 6.2 The provisions relating to the issue, amount of charge, replacement and renewal of Residents Permits, Visitor Permits Tradesmans Permits and Carers Permits shall be determined by reference to the City Council of Lancaster (Parking Permits and Charges) Order 2004, as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment.

#### 7 PENALTY CHARGE AND PAYMENT

- 7.1 Where a vehicle waits parks or is left on a road in contravention of Articles 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12 of this order or fails to comply with the provisions of this order insofar as it relates to a vehicle waiting, parking or being left on a road then a Penalty Charge shall be payable.
- 7.2 The "Penalty Charge" and "Reduced Penalty Charge" shall be set and varied from time to time under the provisions of Section 74 of the 1991 Act, such charge being payable by virtue of Paragraph 3(1) and (2) of Schedule 3 of the Act of 1991 in the manner set out in the Penalty Charge Notice.
- 7.3 In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge is payable a Penalty Charge Notice may be issued by a Parking Attendant in accordance with the requirements of Section 66 of the Act of 1991.
- 7.4 Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been issued the Penalty Charge shall be payable by the owner of the vehicle in respect of which that notice was issued in accordance with Section 66 of the Act of 1991 on the scale set out in the Schedule of Charges of this order.
- 7.5 Where a Penalty Charge is payable and has not been paid to the Council within 28 days of the issue of the Penalty Charge Notice the Council may serve a notice in accordance with Section 66 and Section 6 of the Act of 1991 on the person who appears to them to have been the owner of the vehicle when the alleged contravention occurred.

The Prohibitions and Restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

# URGENT BUSINESS – THE CITY COUNCIL OF LANCASTER (VARIOUS ROADS) (ON STREET PARKING PLACES PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) (NO 2) ORDER 2006

Members are requested to consider seventy three letters of objection to the proposed Traffic Regulation Order, in accordance with the Council's Urgent Business Procedure, details of which are set out within the attached report.

The urgency for this decision is that due to a clerical error with the previous decision it is necessary to enact the decision prior to the transfer of the Highways function to the County Council and it is impracticable to defer the decision until the publication date for Individual Cabinet Member Decisions.

The recommendation is that consideration be given to the objections received and thereafter the implementation of The City Council of Lancaster (Various Roads) (On Street Parking Places Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (No 2) Order 2006 and that the Order be approved subject to the amendments listed in the attached documentation.

The approval of the Chief Executive in consultation with the Chairman of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee has been sought to this action in accordance with Overview and Scrutiny Committee Procedure Rule 17(a) in order that implementation of the decision is not further delayed. Please note that this is subject to your agreement to the proposal.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE HEAD OF DEMOCRATIC SERVICES**

That consideration be given to the objections received and thereafter the implementation of The City Council of Lancaster (Various Roads) (On Street Parking Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (No 3) Order 2006

## 1.0 Introduction

The statutory procedure for making an Order, under Section 1, 2, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49, 53, 63A and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Act, 1984, is set out in the Traffic Orders (Procedures) Regulations, 1989 (as amended). A draft Order was drafted and advertised in accordance with those regulations and subsequently the following objections were received:

### 2.0 **Proposal Details**

Details of the proposal are contained in Appendix A

## 3.0 Details of Consultation

### 3.1 Cork Road

- i) A resident of Canterbury Avenue welcomes the proposals for Cork Road but feels that the parking problem will be pushed round the corner into Exeter Avenue and Canterbury Avenue and requests that consideration is given to the introduction of a no waiting restriction on these street corners for safety reasons.
- A Ward Councillor states that the parking problem is caused by drivers who attend St Martins College, therefore a Monday – Friday 9.00 am – 6.00 pm restriction would be sufficient rather than waiting prohibited at any time. He also asks that consideration be given to the introduction of a no waiting restriction on the corners of Ulster Road, Exeter Avenue and Canterbury Avenue for road safety reasons.

#### 3.2 Norfolk Street/Owen Road

i) The resident objects to the no waiting at any time restriction around his home, he feels that an alternative arrangement could be made for buses.

#### 3.3 <u>St Oswald Street</u>

Fifteen letters were received regarding the proposed no waiting at any time restrictions on St Oswald Street, the following points were raised:

- i) The two proposed passing places on the south side of St Oswald street are a good idea.
- ii) The decision not to introduce a residents parking scheme is welcomed.
- iii) It was suggested that parking spaces be created at the junction of St Oswalds Street and St Martins Road.
- iv) The proposals will bar many residents from parking in their own street.
- v) The proposal benefits a bus route and through traffic rather than the residents of the street.
- vi) It was suggested that St Martin's College be allowed to expand their oncampus parking to help alleviate the parking problem.
- vii) It was suggested that a resident's parking scheme is the answer to the problem.

### 4.0 Options and Options Analysis (including risk assessment)

- 4.2 Not to make the Order
- 4.3 To make the Order with amendments

## 5.0 Officer Preferred Option (and comments)

- 5.1 The officer preferred option is to make the order with an amendment to reduce the length of the proposed 'No Waiting' restriction in the Owen Road/Aldren's Lane area as follows:
  - i) Delete the reference to Owen Road in the Second Schedule of the Order and insert the following:

Owen Road (Section adjacent to Norfolk Street junction)

i)	From a point 14 metres south of the centre line of	Westerly
,	Norfolk Street to the highway boundary of Aldren's	side.
	Lane.	
ii)	From a point 12 metres south of the centre line of	Easterly side.
	Norfolk Street to the highway boundary of Aldren's

	15 metres north of the centre line of Norfolk Street.	side.

This amendment reduces the length of the proposed 'No Waiting' restriction in front of 2 Aldrens Lane by 4 metres and the length of the restriction in front of 2 Owen Road by 2 metres.

With regard to the objections:-

- 5.2 The restrictions in the traffic order cannot be made more restrictive, therefore waiting restrictions cannot be introduced in the side roads leading off Cork Road.
- 5.3 It is accepted that obstruction problems are observed more during the college hours in term time, however, it is recommended that the 'No Waiting At Any Time' restriction should not be amended because:
  - i) Obstruction of vehicles such as buses and fire tenders will occur if vehicles are parked opposite each other on both sides of Cork Road, regardless of the time of day (it should be noted that the bus that is regularly obstructed in this area is a small one). The proposed restriction will prevent this happening at all times.
  - ii) The request for a reduction in the restricted period is based on the assumption that there are fewer vehicles parked overnight and therefore there is less likelihood of obstruction occurring, however this cannot be guaranteed. It is noted that the properties in Cork Road area have off-street parking areas and, when there are fewer cars parked, such as in the evening, there is more opportunity for visitors to find a parking space nearby.
  - iii) In roads such as Cork Road, which are relatively narrow and contain no parking restrictions, drivers tend to park partly on the footway, where they obstruct the footway and damage its surface. The introduction of a full-time restriction on one side of the road will encourage drivers to park fully on the carriageway rather than partly on the footway.
- 5.4 The officer preferred option is to make the order with an amendment to the length of the proposed 'No Waiting' restriction in Owen Road running into Aldrens Lane.
- 5.5 The bus route along Norfolk Street has been established for many years and there is a public demand for a bus route through the area. Diverting along other residential

streets in the area it could only be achieved by carrying out costly engineering works and the residents of those streets are highly likely to object. It is proposed to reduce the length of the 'No Waiting' restriction outside the objector's property on Owen Road.

- 5.6 A number of the objectors appear to be under the impression that a 'No Waiting' restriction is to be introduced along the whole length of one side of St Oswald Street, whereas the proposal includes the area near its junction with St Martin's Road plus 2 No. 12 metre lengths, which will provide two passing places for vehicles.
- 5.7 A recent consultation regarding the introduction of a residents' parking scheme in the St Oswald Street area indicated that the majority of residents were not in favour of such a scheme.

#### 6.0 Conclusion

- 6.1 The areas of highway referred to in this report are locations where the Council has received many reports of parked vehicles obstructing buses and emergency services' vehicles and it is considered that the proposals contained in the traffic regulation order will solve that problem.
- 6.1 The City Council's Ward Members have been consulted and the following responses were received:-
  - Three Members want the proposed 'No Waiting At Any Time' restriction in Cork Road to be amended to a 'No Waiting, 9am to 4pm, Monday to Friday' restriction. (Note: the bus service operates Monday to Saturday and runs along Cork Road up to 6pm).
  - ii) Two Members agree with the proposed restrictions in the Owen Road/Aldrens Lane area.
  - iii) One Member supports the objection to 'No Waiting' restrictions in the Owen Road/Aldrens Lane area and wants the bus route to be changed, so that it runs down Broadway.

The City Council of Lancaster (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act, 1972 with the County Council of Lancashire in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49, 53, 63A and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(hereinafter called the "1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and Section 43 and Schedules 3 and 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1991(hereinafter called the "1991 Act") hereby make the following order.

#### 1. Commencement, Citation and Revocation

- 1.1 This Order shall come into operation on ?????? and may be cited as "The City Council of Lancaster (Various Roads)(On Street Parking)( Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (No 3) Order, 2006".
- 1.2 The Orders specified in the first column of Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked insofar as they relate to the lengths of road specified in the second column of the said Schedule.

#### 2. <u>Interpretations</u>

- 2.1 Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 2.2 In this order, except where the context otherwise, requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them: -
  - 2.2.1 "**1984 Act**" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Road Traffic Act 1991.
  - 2.2.2 "Authorised Parking Place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagrams 1032 or 1033 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
  - 2.2.3 **"Centre Line**" means the centre line of a highway as shown on Ordnance Survey graphical information systems at the time that the order was prepared
  - 2.2.4 **"Coach Parking Place**" means any area of highway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.3 variant in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
  - 2.2.5 "**Disabled Person**" means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.

## 2.2.6 "Disabled Persons Badge" means a badge which:-

- was issued or has effect as if issued to a disabled person or institution under the Disabled Persons (Badge for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000 or under regulations having effect in Scotland or Wales under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970; and
- 2.) has not ceased to be in force.
- 2.2.7 **"Driver**" in relation to a vehicle left at or waiting in a Parking Place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left at or is waiting at the Parking Place.
- 2.2.8 **"Enactment**" means any enactment, whether public, general, or local and includes any order, bylaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;
- 2.2.9 **"Highway Boundary"** means the borderline of the highway as shown on the plans of the adopted highway produced and kept by the Highway authority or its agents.
- 2.2.10 "Invalid Carriage" means a mechanically propelled vehicle of which the unladen weight does not exceed 254 kilograms and which is specifically designed and constructed and not merely adapted for the use of a person suffering from some physical defect or disability and is used solely by such a person as defined in S.185 of the Road Traffic Act 1988
- 2.2.11 "Light Goods Vehicle" means a Goods Vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description whose laden weight does not exceed 2040kg.
- 2.2.12 **"Loading" and "Unloading**" means the continuous transference from (or to) a vehicle to (or from) premises adjacent to where the vehicle is parked of heavy or unmanageable Goods that are not designed to be carried by hand other than over a very short distance.
- 2.2.13 **"Parking Attendant**" means a parking attendant as defined in S.63A of The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which is inserted by S44 (1) of the Road Traffic Act 1991).
- 2.2.14 "Parking Charge" means the sum specified.
- 2.2.15 "Parking Disc" means a device which-
  - is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue, if issued on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2000 or orange if issued before that date;
  - has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
  - 3) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun.
- 2.2.16 **"Parking Services Manager**" means a person appointed by the Council to administer the powers conferred on the Council by the 1984 Act and the 1991 Act with respect to this and other Traffic Regulation Orders.
- 2.2.17 **"Parking Waiver"** means a document issued by the Parking Services Manager to temporarily exempt a vehicle from the waiting restriction in a restricted road.
- 2.2.18 "Pay and Display Parking Place" means any area of highway which

is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagrams 1028.4 variant, 1032 when individual bays are required or 1033 as specified within The Traffic Signs and General Directions 2002 as appropriate with respect to Article 21 but excluding any Disabled Persons Parking Places.

- 2.2.19 **"Permitted Hours**" means in accordance with the periods specified in the corresponding Schedules.
- 2.2.20 "Telecommunications Apparatus" has the same meaning as in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984.
- 2.2.21 **"Traffic Sign**" means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under, Section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2.2.22 "**Trailer**" means any vehicle other than a motor vehicle.
- 2.2.23 "Universal Service Provider" has the same meaning as that assigned to it under the Postal Services Act 2000 (Consequential Modifications to Local Enactment No1) Order 2001.
- 2.2.24 **"Vehicle**" means a motor vehicle, a passenger vehicle, a dualpurpose vehicle, a goods vehicle, a motorcycle or an invalid carriage.
- 2.3 Any reference in this order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended or substituted by any subsequent enactment.
- 2.4 Any reference in this order to a masculine gender shall include reference to the feminine gender and neuter gender.
- 2.5 Any reference in this Order to a singular includes the plural.
- 2.6 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2.7 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

## PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS ON THE WAITING OF VEHICLES

### 3. Waiting Restrictions

#### <u>No Waiting</u>

3.1 Save as provided in Article 4 of this order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in the first column of Schedule 2 to this Order on the side or sides of road specified in the second column of the said schedule.

3.2 Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait more than 30 minutes, return prohibited within one hour in any of the roads specified in the first column of Schedule 3 to this Order on the side or sides of road specified opposite that road or length of road in the second column of the said Schedule.

- 3.3 Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait more than 30 minutes, return prohibited within one hour, between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive, in any of the roads specified in the first column of Schedule 4 to this Order on the side or sides of road specified opposite that road or length of road in the second column of the said Schedule.
- 3.4 Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait more than 1 hour, return prohibited within 2 hours, in any of the roads specified in the first column of Schedule 5 to this Order on the side or sides of road specified opposite that road or length of road in the second column of the said Schedule.

#### 4 Exemptions from Waiting Restrictions

- 4.1 Nothing in Articles 3.1, 3.2, 3.3 or 3.4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road or on the side of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
  - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) a vehicle which is in the service of or employed by a "Universal Service Provider" to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in accordance with the Postal Services Act 2000;

(c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:

- i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
- ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or side of road; or
- iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair or servicing in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of road or side of road of any sewer or of any pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984:

(d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any road, to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

(e) the vehicle to be employed in the recovery of another vehicle;

(f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;

(g) a Public Service Vehicle to be used in the operation of a local service waiting during a Layover period at any duly authorised bus stop or bus stand;

(h) the vehicle to wait at or near any premises situated on or adjacent to the said side or any of the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral.

4.2 Nothing in Articles 3.1, 3.2, 3.3 or 3.4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle in the lengths of road referred to therein.

- 4.3 Nothing in Article 3.1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any lengths of road or on the side of road referred to in that article/those articles for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).
- 4.4 Nothing in Articles 3.2, 3.3 or 3.4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, to wait in any lengths of road or on the side of road referred to in that article articles.

The Prohibitions and Restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
