## **Report of Chief Executive**

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To provide Members with an update of the Committee's Work Programme.

#### 1. Introduction

At the beginning of each Municipal Year suggestions are invited from members of the public, City Councillors and officers on ideas for this year's Work Programme(s).

### 2. Suggested Topics

Management Team has reviewed the topics that could be referred to the Committee. From the list attached Management Team recommends the Committee to consider scrutinising the following issues: -

- Heysham Gateway (submitted by Councillor Hartley and Management Team).
- Skills and Information (submitted by Councillor Caroline Jackson);
- Fly Grazing (submitted by Councillor Brayshaw);
- Voluntary, Community and Faith Sector Commissioning (submitted by Management Team).

Further details on each of these issues will be provided to the Committee, including an explanation of those issues that have been recommended not to be taken forward. Additional topics with timescales are in Appendix A (Work Programme).

Members are reminded that there are 9 scheduled meetings of the Committee each municipal year. 2 of these meetings are required to consider specific issues, these are Community Safety and Older People's Issues. The Community Safety meeting is required by statute, the annual Older People's Issues was designated by the Committee.

#### 2. Older People's Issues

Members will recall at the June meeting of the Committee, it was agreed to approach the Cabinet Member with Responsibility for Older People to ascertain what topic would be appropriate for the Committee to consider at its annual meeting for Older Peoples issues.

The Cabinet Member has been consulted and has suggested that isolation and loneliness are still a major issue for people as they grow older. If the Committee wishes to consider these issues County Councillors representing this District and County Council Officers could be asked to attend and report on these issues.

Management Team has suggested that, with the limited number of meetings available, the Committee consider whether they might wish to make the meeting for Older Peoples issues an extra meeting, additional to the 9 scheduled meetings. It should also be noted that, at the time when the Committee made the decision to devote one of its meetings to Older Peoples issues every year, the Council did not have Cabinet Member with special responsibility for Older People. Now that the Council has a Cabinet member with the portfolio for older people, the Committee may wish to dispense with the special meeting approach and raise Older Peoples issues, such as isolation and loneliness, when the Cabinet Member for Older People attends Overview and Scrutiny to discuss her portfolio.

#### 3. Updates on other Work Programme Items

#### Property Strategy

The Strategy has been delayed to date due to limitations on resources to undertake this work. However, the Committee may wish to receive a discussion report on the factors which the Council would consider important when making decisions about property and a strategic review of assets. This discussion paper will help inform the formulation of the Property Strategy.

#### Leader of the Council

As agreed at the last Committee meeting, the Leader of the Council was invited to attend the September meeting. Unfortunately, the Leader has another commitment that evening but has offered to attend the October meeting.

#### Crime and Disorder Meeting

As Members will be aware each year the Committee is required to meet to discuss and consider crime and disorder issues. At its meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> June the Committee agreed that an overview of the work of the Community Safety Partnership be provided at the November 2016 Community Safety meeting.

Since that meeting the City Council has been contacted by Lancashire Police. The Police have asked if the newly appointed Chief Inspector could attend the meeting. As well as attending the meeting this will assist with creating a relationship with members.

The Committee may feel it appropriate to also invite the Cabinet member with the portfolio for community safety and disorder, together with all other members of Council.

#### Referral from Council: Review of Measures taken to counter Racism, Xenophobia, 4. and Hate Crime

At the Council meeting on 13th July, a Motion relating to a diverse and tolerant society was considered and the Council made the following decisions. Resolution (3), in bold type, is for this committee to consider:-

- We are proud to live in a diverse and tolerant society. Racism, xenophobia and hate (1) crimes of any description have no place in our country. We at Lancaster City Council condemn racism, xenophobia and hate crimes unequivocally. We will not allow such behaviour to become acceptable. We will work with other bodies, Community Safety Partnership, Communities together, Lancashire county council, Town and Parish councils to challenge such behaviour and prevent such crimes. Lancaster City council wishes to assure all of the Districts residents and visitors that they are valued members of our society.
- (2) That the statement above is displayed on the city council website, that it also directs residents to www.istreetwatch.co.uk for anonymous reporting of hate crime and that a press release is issued to publicise the motion.
- (3) That Council recommends the Overview and Scrutiny Committee review the current local and city council measures taken to counter racism, xenophobia, and hate crime and report back to Full Council as soon as practicable.
- That all councillors consider increasing their involvement with, and support for, those organisations which strengthen communities and increase tolerance and respect between peoples from different countries, cultures and faiths.

#### Officer briefing note:-

Community Leadership is one of the four priorities in the Council's Corporate Plan. The Council is committed to bringing communities together and addressing the major issues affecting the district through working in partnership. The role of the council is summarised in the Corporate Plan and includes maintaining a cohesive community.

As a point of information for Members, Lancaster District Community Safety Partnership (CSP) is a collective of public, voluntary, community and private organisations who come together to do all that they can to make the district's communities safer. The CSP provides a co-ordinated response to community safety issues, drawing together organisations and people that can make a difference. Lancaster district CSP's membership comprises:

- Lancaster City Council
- Lancashire Constabulary
- Lancashire County Council
- Lancashire Fire & Rescue Services
- Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner
- Cumbria and Lancashire Community Rehabilitation Company (Probation)
- Youth Offending Team
- North Lancashire CCG

Whilst hate crime isn't one of the CSP's current priorities, the Partnership receives information from the Constabulary on crime spikes and trends so it can review its priorities accordingly.

The Communities Together group has representation from many diverse religious and ethnic groups in the district as well as the community and voluntary sector, Lancashire County Council, Lancaster City Council, Lancaster University, University of Cumbria and Lancashire Constabulary.

#### Appendix C

#### **Lancashire County Council's Pre-Scrutiny process**

The County Council established an Executive Scrutiny Committee (ESC) in 2013. This is a formal Committee, politically balanced and chaired by an opposition member which meets two days before Cabinet and considers all reports which are to be considered by Cabinet. In addition, the ESC considers all Key Decisions which will are to be made by individual Cabinet Members in the coming month.

The Committee has been established with 13 Members. In addition to the Committee, all Cabinet Members and the County Council's Officer Management Team attend to present reports and answer questions. The specialist officer responsible for the service in the report will also attend as well for each item. If a special meeting of Cabinet is required a meeting of the ESC will also be arranged as well, even if this means holding them both on the same day.

The ESC has no power to stop a decision being made. Like any scrutiny committee the ESC can only make recommendations. There is an item at the beginning of every Cabinet Agenda for the Chairman of the ESC to report the Committee's views or decisions. There have not been many times when the ESC has not accepted the main recommendations of reports going to Cabinet or Cabinet Members, but there have been quite a number of times where there have been supplementary recommendations suggested, or requests that the Cabinet/Cabinet Member defer a decision or part of it.

The Terms of Reference of the ESC are:

#### **Terms of Reference**

- 1. To review and scrutinise reports and decisions due for consideration by the Cabinet collectively, and to make recommendations to Cabinet on those reports and decisions.
- 2. To review and scrutinise Key Decisions, other than the making of Traffic Regulation Orders of all kinds including Speed Limit Orders, due for consideration by individual Cabinet Members and to make recommendations to Cabinet Members on those decisions.
- 3. To review and scrutinise Key Decisions due for consideration by Cabinet Committees, and to make recommendations to the relevant Cabinet Committee on those decisions.
- 4. The committee may invite to any meeting of the Committee and permit to participate in discussion and debate, but not to vote, any person not a County Councillor whom the Committee considers would assist it in carrying out its functions.
- 5. To require any Councillor, an Executive Director or a senior officer nominated by him/her to attend any meeting of the Committee to answer questions and discuss issues in relation to the reports and decisions before it for consideration.
- 6. To appoint a Budgetary Scrutiny Working Group and receive recommendations from it in order to make recommendations to Cabinet on its budget proposals to Full Council.
